 Necessary radiographs using a lead apron over the abdomen and thyroid. 	 If non-narcotic pain management is needed, Category B drugs such as over-the-counter acetaminophen may be used. If narcotic pain management is needed, acetaminophen with codeine #3 during first and second trimesters.
 Restorative and prophylaxis care (including scaling and root planing if necessary), and or extractions. 	
• Local anesthetic, 2% lidocaine.	
• If antibiotic is needed, Category B drugs such as amoxicillin, erythromycin, cephalosporins.	Oral rinse chlorhexidine gluconate 0.12%.
	 Prescribed preventive agents such as PreviDent, Fluoridex, and Clinpro dentifrices.
